

# Dan Schiller



Professor Dan Schiller is a historian of information and communications. The author of half a dozen books and many research articles, he has written extensively on the development and current structure of digital capitalism. His current research focuses on the role of information and communications in today's financial/economic crisis and on the history of U.S. telecommunications infrastructures. He was Professor of Library and Information Science at UCLA and then Professor of Communication at UCSD before assuming his present position as Professor of Library and Information Science and of Communication at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Schiller has been working at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign since 2015.
