Dr Paško Bilić is a Senior Research Associate at the Department for Culture & Communication, Institute for Development and International Relations in Zagreb, Croatia. He holds a PhD in sociology (2013) from the University of Zagreb. He was an International Visiting Research Fellow at the Institute for Advanced Studies, University of Westminster (London, UK), and Doctoral Research Fellow at the University of Alberta (Edmonton, Canada). His research interests evolved from collaborative online cultures to political economies of platforms and digital monopolies. He published on topics such as digital capitalism, digital news, internet culture, media theory and media regulation. His work is published in journals such as Internet Histories, Javnost, Political Economy of Communication, tripleC: Communication, Capitalism & Critique, New Media & Society, European Journal of Communication, and Big Data & Society. He is vice-coordinator of the European Sociological Association's Research Network 18: Sociology of Media and Communications Research. He is the course director of an advanced, international PhD course the Political Economies of Media at the Interuniversity Centre in Dubrovnik, Croatia. Currently, he is preparing a special issue in the journal Critical Sociology titled Critical Sociology of Media and Communication: Theoretical contributions to a disconnected field.
